4th Regional Conference on "Accident Prevention: Road Safety Measures"

With the focus on economic development, infrastructure has been recognized as a catalyst for development across the nations. In infrastructure, roads and road transport serving the public needs of mobility have their own special place in the economic development of a country. Out of all accidents that happen in transportation systems, road transport being most pervasive, is unfortunately the largest killer. In India alone more than 100,000 lives are lost every year in road accidents. Justifiably International Road Federation had held the 3rd Regional Conference in October 2008 on 'Mobility and Safety in Road Transport' to deliberate on the issues related to the price that is being paid for mobility that we enjoy through road transport. The Conference had made a fervent recommendation that all agencies in India must work collectively to reduce road fatalities to half (i.e. 50% of the present level) in next 3 years with built-in review mechanism. While IRF India Chapter is taking up this matter with various authorities, it is time to review our strategies on accident prevention through road safety measures. With this aim in view, the topic of the forthcoming 4th Regional Conference has been chosen, which will be of interest to all professionals and public at large.

It is essential to systematically consider the various safety measures and their impact on accident prevention in any road project. The aim should be to ensure that provision of appropriate safety measures are taken for effective prevention of accidents under mixed traffic conditions. A comprehensive road safety program for an area shall have accident causation analysis leading to most suitable preventive measures. Appropriate countermeasures and their implementation are likely to bring huge benefits in terms of gradual reduction of accidents. To address these issues the International Road Federation (IRF) is organizing its Fourth Regional Conference on "Accident Prevention: Road Safety Measures" on 23rd and 24th October 2009 at India Habitat Centre, Lodhi Road, New Delhi, India.

The two-day Conference will be addressed by eminent experts from both India and abroad. The speakers from the developed countries will bring-forth their experience, methodology and knowledge used in tackling vital issues relating to accident prevention and road safety measures. Some of the developed countries have been successful to systematically control the road safety hazards through adoption of carefully designed accident prevention measures. The interaction between participants from the developed and the developing countries will provide an effective platform for exchange of views and formulating strategies, which could be implemented to serve the interest of various stakeholders with ultimate aim of accident prevention.

Objectives

In the context of fast economic development in India and the region, infrastructure plays a pivotal role. Movement of men and materials is of prime importance and needs to be kept in focus for highest logistical efficiency. Road transport has emerged as the most significant and favoured mode for both short and medium distance travel, compared to all other modes. The modern society, both in urban and non-urban areas, lives for the mobility advantage. Higher mobility levels, provided by road transport, have unfortunately brought in a menace, which is growing uncontrolled at this time. Road accident is one of the highest killer globally. The Indian subcontinent and the region, unfortunately have a very poor level of road safety. While it needs a deeper introspection about the causative factors, it is true that a serious multi-dimensional approach is required to tackle this socio-technical problem.

Many accidents are predictable, and therefore, preventable. This is evident from the fact that countries in Europe and other advanced countries have been able to reduce the number of accidents to a great extent, in spite of high vehicle ownership and much higher vehicle density. However, the number of accidents in India are growing unabated, rather at a phenomenal rate. It is necessary to tackle this with seriousness by according national priority, with top most level of political commitment and aiming for targeted and time bound reduction of road deaths. All planners, engineers and road managers have to be sensitized to address this issue with extra zeal and passion for better safety outcomes.



The Objective of the Fourth IRF Regional Conference is to offer a forum for meaningful interaction amongst the important stakeholders of the Region, with their counterparts from the developed world, and to set up international networking, to devise road sector policies beneficial to business and environment of future developments in India and the Region. This Regional Conference will be laying great emphasis on the road safety measures and their appropriateness and effectiveness in Accident Prevention.

Eminent experts belonging to various disciplines of road safety from a number of advanced and developing countries are expected to participate in this Conference. Thus, the delegates from India and the region will have a good opportunity to benefit from their interaction with speakers and delegates from other parts of the world, and share experiences. This will give an excellent platform to exchange ideas and evolve ways and means for tackling highway safety problems in a decisive manner, by adopting more effective accident prevention measures. Simply building better roads, with improved traffic operations, offering smooth riding surface may not enhance safety. Integrated transport development across all other modes of travel and not only for motorized modes, with due space allocation for such modes (promoting NMT) are also the indirect measures. Road safety needs to be institutionalized and advanced technologies (like ITS) are required to be adopted for preventing causation of accidents.
