

Training programs for Commercial vehicle drivers and School Transport Drivers

Regarding transportation of children from school to home and home to school, it is imperative that school drivers should have proper training in transporting the children safely. Our module emphasizes sensitivity, information, awareness along with defensive driving skills and fatal factors

The professional drivers in India at times lack professionalism as they are mostly uneducated and untrained. There are frequent instances of speeding, drunk driving and at times underage driving - more frequent on highways (National and State). We have worked with Jaipur Metro Corporation, Rajasthan State Roadways Transport Corporation (RSRTC), Hindustan Petroleum Corporation Limited, and Mini Bus, Uber Cabs Pvt. Ltd., Jaipur Transport and Operators Association, Tata Motors, etc


