
Recent Activities of IRF-IC

ROAD SAFETY WEEK AND CONFERENCE

IRF - IC kicked off the year with a conference themed "Fast Tracking Road Safety through 5Es" organized as part of the Road Safety Week observed by the Ministry of Road Transport & Highways (MoRTH). The Conference was inaugurated by the Chief Guest, Justice (Retd.) Adarsh Kumar Goel, Chairperson, National Green Tribunal. The Guest of Honour at the event was Justice (Retd.) J.R. Midha.

The conference provided a platform for the road safety experts and stakeholders to discuss and deliberate on issues encompassing Engineering of Roads, Engineering of Vehicles & Policy Interventions, Education & Mass Awareness, Enforcement, Emergency Response (5Es). This event set the tone for the year, emphasizing a comprehensive approach to road safety.

ROAD SAFETY AUDIT IN DELHI

In February, IRF-IC undertook a critical road safety audit, focusing on 14 blackspots in Delhi. The audit aimed at identifying potential hazards and proposing targeted interventions to improve road safety. The findings have since been shared with local authorities, serving as a blueprint for enhancements infrastructure enforcement measures to mitigate risks in these high-risk areas. The recommendations have already been shared with the concerned department for implementation. The following blackspots locations were:

- 1. Nirankari Intersection
- Timarpur Intersection (Intersection of Outer Ring Road and Wazirabad Road near Signature Bridge)
- Yamuna Bazar Intersection (Intersection of Ring Road and Ring Road bypass near Yamuna Bazar).





- 5. Chirag Delhi Intersection
- Zakhira Flyover Intersection of Rohtak Road and Satguru Ram Singh Road
- 7. Punjabi Bagh Chowk
- 8. Peeragarhi Chowk
- 9. Mundka Metro Station

- 10. Dabri Crossing Roundabout
- 11. Mukarba Chowk
- 12. Intersection of Grand Trunk Road and Main Libaspur Road.
- 13. Azadpur Chowk
- 14. Outer Ring Road in Front of Rohini Court near Madhuban Chowk

LECTURE SERIES ON ROAD SAFETY

Continuing the commitment to education and awareness. IRF launched a Lecture Series on Road Safety in May. This monthly series featured distinguished speakers covering diverse aspects of road safety, including driver behavior, technology interventions. policy frameworks and community engagement. The Lecture Series has played a pivotal role in disseminating knowledge and fostering a culture of safety.

The inaugural lecture, "From Home to School, are our children safe?" was presented by Prof. Prajapati Trivedi, Commonwealth Secretary-General's Special Envoy for SDG Implementation and sponsored by Orafol India Pvt. Ltd. Subsequent lectures included "Traffic Enforcement & Their Challenges" by Mr. Satyendra Garg, IPS, sponsored by Traffitek, and "Traffic Management – the Ground Realities – Delhi as a case study" by Dr. Rohit Baluja. Bajaj addressed "Challenges Faced by an Accident Victim — Mental, Financial and Physical," while Mr. Amit S. Kumar explored "Driver's Psychology & Behaviour — Influence of Technology." Prof. P.K Sikdar discussed "When our Roads are built following Standards, why do Accidents occur?" The series continued with Mr. K.K. Kapila discussing "Road Safety in India — A function of 5Es" and Mr. Balraj Bhanot covering "Role of ITS in Road Safety."

The Ministry of Education had accordingly disseminated it to the Education Secretaries of States & Union Territories for propagation to Schools under KVS & NVS. Similarly the Govt. of Uttar Pradesh had also initiated efforts to propagate the anthem in all the Schools in the State.

IRF-IC COALITION FOR ROAD SAFETY PROGRAMME

October witnessed the launch of the IRF-IC Coalition for Road Safety Programme, a collaborative effort involving various stakeholders. The programme aims to bring together expertise and resources to address road safetv challenges comprehensively. The signing ceremony witnessed commitment of diverse stakeholders work collectively towards achieving safer roads globally.

The event commenced with a warm welcome from our IRF-IC Founder President, Mr. K.K. Kapila. He shared the vision of IRF-IC and the impactful work we are doing in the field of road safety and we were honored to have Mr. Jean Todt Special Road Safety Envoy of UN Secretary General from

the United Nations Office at Geneva, who shared invaluable insights and perspectives on the importance of global collaboration for road safety. His presence and wisdom added a global dimension to our efforts.

The Conference served as a unifying platform for various stakeholders passionate about road safety. More than 15 individuals, representing their organizations, enthusiastically joined hands and signed a coalition for road safety. This gesture symbolized a shared commitment to work collaboratively and relentlessly towards safer roads.

The Conference was graced by representatives from esteemed organizations, including MoRTH,

MES, 3M India, Trax, Muskaan Foundation, Netradyne, GrandPitStop, PVR and many others.

THE FIRST ACCIDENT FATALITY FREE CITY INITIATIVE- JODHPUR

In November, IRF-IC in collaboration with MBM University undertook a pioneering initiative to transform Jodhpur into the first accident fatality-free city by Dec, 2024. This comprehensive programme involved community engagement, infrastructure improvements and awareness campaigns, setting a precedent for holistic approaches to city-wide road safety.

In the initial phase, we have identified 29 junctions in the city for rectification and redesign—a crucial step toward achieving our goal. Our dedicated team is actively conducting topography and traffic movement count surveys at these junctions. As part of our comprehensive approach, we are also in the process of installing Advanced Traffic Management Systems (ATMS) throughout the entire city.

As of now, 12 out of the 29 identified junctions have undergone topography surveys with the remaining junctions scheduled for completion in the first half of January 2024. Simultaneously, our teams are diligently conducting traffic movement count surveys at all 29 junctions with an anticipated completion date by January 2024. This will provide invaluable insights into the traffic dynamics of these key intersections, guiding our efforts to implement effective measures for enhanced safety.

Looking ahead, our second phase will focus on identifying stretches in the periphery of the city where fatalities are more prevalent. A detailed safety audit and corrections will be carried out on these stretches, further fortifying our commitment to creating a safer environment for all residents.



Under E2 interventions, IRF-IC had undertaken in collaboration with its member Avery Dennison India Pvt. Ltd launched a drive to provide and apply conspicuity tapes on bicycles to enhance their visibility during day time and especially during night time. The campaign was conducted in cooperation with the National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) and AIIMS with support of IRF-IC member Avery Dennison in Jodhpur.

The initiative aimed at promoting the safety of bicycle riders by applying Avery Dennison Conspicuity Tapes on the bicycles. Cyclists are most vulnerable to road accidents as their night-time visibility is compromised as a result of hindrance by other road users or surrounding lighting conditions. The Avery Dennison Conspicuity tape is designed to provide night-time recognition by adding visibility to the vehicle.

Now-a-days, the Government is aiming to provide separate lanes for bi-cycle riders which are proving fruitful. However, in urban areas most of the major roads are still shared by bi-cycles, cars, trucks etc. which renders bi-cycle drivers vulnerable to road accidents. To address the tragic state of affairs, IRF implemented the campaign, which has been successful in generating interest and awareness amongst cyclists in the city.

Under the E3 intervention on Road Safety Education, IRF-IC had facilitated a "Train the Trainers" programme to Airforce Personnel & Military Hospital Personnel in Jodhpur. In all over 300 Personnel have been trained so far

FIRST AID TRAUMA CARE TRAINING PROGRAMME

IRF-IC in collaboration with Maruti Suzuki's IDTR network is committed to train drivers to act as First Responders during the "Golden Hour" of road accident cases. In the first phase undertaken during Jan-May, 3500 drivers were trained at IDTRs in Delhi & Haryana. In the second phase launched in December, we are committed to train 5000 drivers in IDTRs in Delhi, Haryana & Bihar.



We are glad to inform you that, to date, we have successfully trained more than 10,000 participants throughout the country making communities safer and prepared, taking mission forward, want to train more so that they can contribute in saving the lives of others.

IRF-IC -5

Under this intervention of E-5 on Emergency Care, activity pertains to a hands-on First Aid Trauma Care Training for Bystanders, Drivers and Volunteers. Under this intervention, Bystanders from road side communities such as villages. Dhabas, Petrol Pumps, Corporate Companies, Toll Plaza and others are identified and imparted a full day training programme by trained Trauma Technicians of IRF-IC. The Trauma Care Team are qualified PTTs (Pre-Hospital Trauma Technicians). The Bystander Training Programme is intended to impart basic life-saving skills and to help an accident victim within the Golden Hour as a Good Samaritan.

The training programme is targeted to deliver practical hands-on skills to improve survival opportunities, customized in particular to handle trauma and injuries, to meet the minimum resuscitation and medical emergencies, required for safe transportation of the patient. There are several reasons why trauma care training is important for drivers. First and foremost, it can help



save lives. Injured individual requires immediate medical further attention to prevent complications and even death. If a driver is trained in trauma care, they provide basic life-saving interventions such stopping as bleeding, clearing the airway, and administering CPR, which significantly increase the chances of survival of the injured person. A driver are are often the first responders to an accident, and therefore, they play a critical role in ensuring that the injured receive prompt and appropriate medical care.

IRF-IC to promote this unique publication printed it and distributed it widely to cover the policy makers in the Centre & States, road safety professionals, our memberships, major libraries in the Country, Chamber of Commerce etc.

The World Road Statistics Book serves as an invaluable resource, offering a detailed compilation of global road-related data, trends and analyses. Its purpose is to empower policymakers with accurate and up-to-date information, fostering informed decision-making in the realm of transportation and infrastructure.

By printing and distributing the book, IRF-IC aims to enhance accessibility, ensuring that key stakeholders including policymakers and researchers, have the necessary tools to address challenges and drive positive change.

Moreover, recognizing the importance of disseminating knowledge, the World Road Statistics Book has been strategically distributed to libraries, further expanding its reach and impact.
